



Altar

This central furnishing in a Christian worship space is usually fairly large, with a solid front that may be decorated with symbols or words. The flat surface, often covered with a cloth, is where the Communion elements are prepared and placed, reminding us of Jesus' sacrifice as the Lamb of God. In some churches, the altar looks more like a table, with open legwork. We remember that Jesus invites us into fellowship with God now and to the heavenly banquet for eternity. We place offerings on the altar to symbolize our sacrificial response to God's redeeming love.

An Endowment Moment...

"What! Grace Church Pays Me Money?"

It comes as quite a surprise to many church members that, after all these years of making gifts to Grace Church, there is now a way for them to get income from Grace Church. It is a common type of gift called a Charitable Gift Annuity that makes this possible for you and other members of Grace Church.

A Charitable Gift Annuity is simply a contract between the member and Grace Church secured by the millions of dollars held by the ELCA Foundation. The ELCA Foundation administers the Charitable Gift Annuity for Grace Church. At the passing of the member the ELCA Foundation returns the then principal of the gift annuity to Grace Church to be placed in the Mission Endowment Fund.

You can give a gift of cash, stocks, or bonds. In return, Grace Church agrees to pay you, the donor, a guaranteed annual annuity for the rest of your life. If you are married, the annuity can also be paid to your spouse for life as well. The annuity amount depends on you age—the older you are, the larger the annuity you will receive each year. Single life rates range from 5.1% for age 70 to 9.0% for members 90 and over.

In addition the annual income (part of which is tax free, by the way!), you will receive an income tax charitable deduction the year you make the gift annuity. Your gift to Grace Church can be large or small, and the gift annuity is very simple to create.
