# Council Minutes <br> Highlights 

March 2015.

- Approved Requests for building use of Fellowship Hall in 2015 from Tiny Tots, on April 15, from 10 A.M. to 2:30 P.M. and June 12, 11:30 A.M., to 3 P.M.; LifeSteps/Early Headstart, April 27, 4:30 to 8 P.M.; and from Chuck Andrews, May 2, Noon to 5 P.M., for use of the Lounge. Pastor noted that effective immediately, he will put a handwritten note on the form, that any group or individual who is not a member, will be required to pay a custodian fee of $\$ 60$. Recently, there have been some problems with users not cleaning up after themselves.
- The treasurer reported Total Income for January of $\$ 17,045.22$ and Total Expenses of $\$ 18,934.70$. Although expenses exceeded income, there is a positive balance in the checking account and all bills prior to February 28 had been paid.
- There will be a rummage sale on May 9. Judy Miller will coordinate. Volunteers are needed.
- Vacation Bible School is July 13-16, 2015.
- Approved the Property Committee's recommendation to sign a new contract with Knighthawk for security service, following thorough investigation with three vendors. New technology will be installed which will allow arming and disarming of the system from a cell (Smart) phone.
- The Stewardship Committee has prepared new Visitor Cards which will be used to obtain contact information for future communication.
- Approved ads for Easter Services in the Beaver County Times and on Facebook.


Meals on Wheels is asking for donations of sugar-free snack items for their diabetic clients. Examples would be Jello, pudding, sugar-free cookies, etc. Donations can be left in the kitchen marked "M.O.W."

## From the Intern <br> Pastor

Just as the body is one, and has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is the Messiah. For we all were baptized into the one body, by one spirit - whether Jews or Greeks, whether slave or free - and we were all given one spirit to drink. (1st Corinthians 1213)

Church is what brings Christians together. Church is what tears Christians apart. Think about this paradox for a moment. Church is at once the thing that draws us together and draws us away from one another. Humm. Think about a time where you've had a disagreement or falling out with someone at church however large or small it may have been. Did this relationship heal? Are you still in disagreement with this person? Whether we like it or not there is something about our 'humanness' that serves only to tear us apart. Saint James and Saint Peter understood this humanness all too well after Pentecost. Both James and Peter believed that they should be the leader of Christ's church (talk about a big disagreement!), and they
both approached this calling in some radically different ways which today are still the cause of some division in the global church. But even with this division both James and Peter sought to glorify their Lord and savior. Paul's words from his letter to the church in Corinth provide us with some great advice concerning division. Paul encourages us to see that even with our differences we all belong to the same body - that body, Christ. While we may all have different ways of looking at the world, worshiping, politics, finances, or even how warm or cold the sanctuary should be, we are all united under the head of our faith, Jesus Christ the risen savior.

## Vine

A vine symbolizes Christ, the foundation of life and nourishment of all people, who, in turn, are like branches. When separated from the vine, we branches can't survive - at least not spiritually. "Apart from me," says Jesus, "you can do nothing" (John 15:5, NIV). But as God the gardener tends this relationship, we branches grow stronger and more mature in Jesus and alongside one another.

## SPRING

Make this beautiful craft to remind you of God's gift of new life at springtime.


- White 11 " x 17 " paper
- Acrylic paint (various spring colors, including green)
- Paintbrush
- Empty two-liter plastic bottle
- Paper plates
- Paper towels


## What you do:

1. With the paper placed vertically, paint stems and leaves with green paint.
2. Pour a different color of paint onto a paper plate. Then place the bottom of the bottle into the paint.
3. Using the bottle as a stamp, press it onto the paper to create a flower atop a green stem.
4. Repeat with different colors on different plates, cleaning the bottle each time, to create a beautiful spring bouquet.

The clergyman, a huge man with a booming voice, sat the younger boy down and asked him sternly, "Where is God?"
