


"Why Review Your Will"

3 What if you bought a new car and then never cleaned or repaired it? Or what if you built a new house but never repainted it. You would own a car and a house that, in some ways, resembled a will that was never updated.

Having any kind of a will is better than not having one at all. But updating your will gives the maximum protection to you, your family, and the organizations you support. As you add to your estate, as marital and family situation changes, if you move to another state, when tax law changes, and as your preferences and charitable interests change, you need to update your will.

Martin Luther was born November 10, 1483 into a musical family. He belonged to a boy's choir and was proficient in playing the flute. He studied music, dance, and singing. Later he became an Augustinian Monk. As time went on and Luther's beliefs changed from those of the Catholic Church the Protestant Reformation emerged.

"Martin Luther's approach to music is formed through the conviction that music is a particularly beautiful and unique offering of the divine creation. Music moves human hearts and allows them to anticipate the heavens to bring people joy and to praise the Lord is music's true task, and, indeed, its service." Luther felt that the whole congregation, not just the priest or cantor, should sing in church in order for Christ to enter the depth of a person's heart. This was achieved when a person sang from an understanding of the words and from their heart and not just saying the words. Martin learned to transcribe, harmonize, and write melodies on psalms in everyday words. His first hymnal with eight hymns were published in 1524.
